Eurasian watermilfoil

Alert

Your help is needed to prevent this noxious weed.

Eurasian watermilfoil is a submersed perennial aquatic plant that adversely impacts aquatic ecosystems. Once established dense canopies shade out native aquatic vegetation.

Characteristics

- Grows in still to flowing waters.
- Roots in water depths up to 33 feet.
- Adaptable and can survive under ice.
- Forms dense canopies that create poor habitat.
- Regenerates from plant fragments, which are easily transported by boats and trailers.

Eurasian watermilfoil can decrease fish populations, increase boat repair costs, add to mosquito populations, weaken native plant diversity, depress real estate values, and inhibit irrigation water flow.

Efforts are underway to prevent the accidental introduction of Eurasian watermilfoil into Henry's Lake.

Boat Washes

Free boat and float tube washes are offered daily at the **Henry's Lake State Park** and **Bill Frome County Park** on the Lake.

High pressure washers are also provided for the public at Wild Rose, the lake fish hatchery, and the state park.

Boater Surveys

Throughout the summer, project staff will ask a series of survey questions enabling them to track possible invasive fragments and prevent spreading.

They will also be able to answer any questions and provide further information about Eurasian watermilfoil.
